## Pre-travel checklist for COPD patients travelling with oxygen

Contact your insurance provider Ask about international coverage for oxygen use; what documents or forms are needed.
Talk to your doctor/pulmonologist  Get oxygen prescription, medical letter (diagnosis, resting and active oxygen needs), and any tests required (for example altitude simulation).
Inform the airline (and other service providers) Find out their policy on portable oxygen concentrators (POCs), battery requirements, medical forms, and any fees.
Find an oxygen provider in the destination country   Ensure oxygen can be delivered there; discuss the exact equipment needed.
Arrange required paperwork Doctor's letter, prescriptions, any airline forms, insurance forms.
Pack supplies and backups  Bring enough oxygen, equipment, and extra batteries for the full trip + delays. Keep medication in carry-on.
Check hotel/accommodation preparations Inform them of your oxygen arrival and ensure they can receive/hold the equipment.
Gather all contact information Contacts for your insurer, oxygen supplier at destination, airline's medical desk, emergency numbers.
Review policies and safety Airline's rules, customs, electricity/plugs, and altitude effects. Check what to do in case of symptom flare-ups.
